“Everything was sort of countrified, I used to go with my grandfather walking an awful lot and I used to go and fetch the milk in a jug from the farmer’s whereas when we lived in Shepperton it came in bottles and the ice cream man used to come round ‘stop me and buy one’ but that didn’t happen in Alton, very much countrified. I think food was basically the same but we did, certainly at Alton we had bread which was actually made in the shop, in the premises, I can remember going and buying the bread for grandma and ha’penny buns that were always fresh. And grandma made her own bread as well, she used to make it, she had an inglenook with the ovens at the side, and made it there which we never did at Shepperton because everything was modern.
