So he did three jobs throughout the whole of the war. He was part of the clergy at Shelton Church, he was the Billeting Officer for Stoke-on-Trent basically and he was the chaplain for Hull, er Stafford prison. And how he managed to fulfil all those I don't know but to me as a youngster he seemed to work 24 hours a day.
